Mission Statement

The mission of Fremont City Schools is to develop well-educated, life-long learners prepared to be responsible, productive and respectful members of their communities.

The Mission Statement: The Fremont City Schools Early College High School will provide first-generation college bound students an opportunity to complete a high interest, rigorous curriculum in a positive, supportive environment so students can earn their high school diploma and certificate and /or associate's degree leading to employment and / or continued post-secondary education.

What type of support will this program offer?

<u>Tutoring</u> – Students will be able to access tutoring for any high school or college class that they are taking during the 4 years of the program.

<u>Counseling</u> – Students will be able to utilize counseling services to discuss issues that may impact their lives.

<u>Academic Scheduling</u> – Students will be able to access academic advisement through Fremont Ross High School counselors and Terra State Community College.

<u>Career Counseling</u> – Students will be able to get advice and job placement services through Terra State Community College and the County Job Store.

<u>Internship</u> – Students will be assigned internships to get practical hands on knowledge of their chosen field of study.

<u>Mentoring</u> – Students will be assigned a mentor who will provide guidance and advice about their chosen field of study and life.

<u>Students with an IEP or 504</u> – Students will continue to receive identified accommodations as listed in their IEP or 504. College coursework may adapt accommodations according to their policy.

Tutoring Services

<u>Tutoring</u> – All College Credit Plus and Early College students will be able to access tutoring for any high school or college class that they are taking during the 4 years of the program.

Where would you gain access to tutoring?

Students interested in receiving tutoring services can request services through their teacher/professor, grade level counselor, Terra State Community College Academic Assistance Program, and the director of the Early College Program. Each program may be accessed through the Director of the Early College Program.

<u>Who initiates the contact?</u> Academic tutoring services can be requested by the student, teacher, professor, the director of the program, and parents.

<u>Who is responsible for tracking the effectiveness of the support?</u> Teachers / professors, students, and the director of the program will track grades and adjust tutoring services based on student need.

<u>How often can a student access these resources?</u> Students can access the online portion of the tutoring services 24 hours a day. Other tutoring may be limited to the times and the dates that the academic labs are open and tutors are available.

<u>College course tutoring on the Ross campus</u> – Each Early College student will be assigned a study hall during their first year of the program. These study halls will be staffed with Fremont Ross teachers who teach within that discipline.

Tutoring Options

Peer Tutoring – Student to student tutoring

Khan Academy – Online tutorial resource

Group Tutoring- Students can be tutored in a small group setting

Teacher Tutoring – The teacher may reteach or arrange for a group of students to get assistance with concepts they are struggling with.

Fremont Ross Resources

Any student needing tutoring services can access tutoring services by contacting their grade level counselor. They will direct them to available student and staff tutoring resources.

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Terra State Community College Resources

Tutoring services

Terra State Community College students are eligible to receive a one hour session per week, per class, of free tutoring for classes in which they are currently enrolled. These sessions are dedicated to specific course assignments and lessons. In the case of Math and Writing you can take advantage of group and one-on-one sessions ONLY after you complete 2 Academic Assistance Lab sessions (see below for details on labs).

Group Tutoring:

Attend a tutoring session with your peers. Small group tutoring sessions (1-5 students) are available upon instructor approval. Your instructor will submit a request and the Academic Service Center will contact you to schedule your session.

Individualized Tutoring:

In limited cases your instructor can request one-on-one sessions with a tutor. Upon approval the Academic Service Center will contact you to arrange your appointment.

Requesting a tutor:

Stop by the Academic Service Center, located in the General Technologies Building, B-105 to pick up a tutoring form.

Academic Assistance Labs

Academic Assistance Labs are free tutoring services for Terra State students who may be struggling in Math or Writing. These sessions are more general in nature than the Tutoring sessions listed above. Academic Assistance Labs are Walk-in and require no prior approval from an instructor. Adjunct faculty or professional tutors staff the Academic Assistance Labs.

Online Tutoring Services

As a Terra State student, you can receive FREE online tutoring from the Ohio E-tutoring Collaborative! The tutors are professionally trained tutors or faculty members from institutions across the state of Ohio.

Subjects available for online tutoring include:

- Accounting
- Biology
- Chemistry
- Math (including Calculus and Statistics)
- Physic and Writing (for any writing assignment in any class)

How do I access these services?

1. Go to the website: eTutoring.org

2. Click "Login Now"

3. Choose "Ohio eTutoring Collaborative" & then "Terra State Community College"

4. Log in, using your assigned Terra State email (usually your first initial and full last name followed by three numbers @terra.edu) and the password "terracc"
